Hangeul, the Korean alphabet, was invented by King Sejong and began to be officially promulgated in 1446. The first handbook created at this time was called "Hunminjeongeum" which means "Correct Sounds to Enlighten the People".

UNESCO added the first Hangeul handbook "Hunminjeongeum" to its "UNESCO Memory of the World Register" as a Global Documentary Heritage in October 1997. Earlier, in 1989, UNESCO designated May 15
